The facility tour began at 10:00 am. Firstly the Coordinator briefed us about the history of Cyberverse Foundation, and how it started and gave the complete business overview.



The day visit was scheduled in the following manner.


It was divided into three sessions. In the first session, we were taken to the auditorium and given the introduction about the institution, briefed about the history of IIITB, functions of IIITB, etc.

Industrial Visit to Royal Shelengor& Chocolate Factory

The studentswere taken to Royal Shelengor on the third day and it was a factory outlet store as well as manufacturing division adjacent to each other. The manufacturing of table wares and gift items and vessels and jewelry is displayed to the students at the store and manufacturing division was also shown as a work around. They make these out of a pewter which is a combination of Tin, Antimony & copper.

The Chocolate factory at KL, Malaysia is called as Harriston Boutique, a unique chocolate experience. Harriston chocolates are made based on time-honored methods and innovative recipes with carefully selected ingredients. The entire process adheres to ISO 9001 and halal certification, rigorous quality control and international hygiene standards.

The students were educated on how the coca at that place is so pure and genuine and its extraction and chocolate making process was explained and demonstrated with a simulator of the factory setting. The students were also educated on the international export of Malaysian chocolates as it is very pure in form. The students purchased chocolates there for their friends and family. Adjacent to it was Malaysian tourism centre since 1935.

OTHER TOURIST PLACES THAT WE VISITED AT MALAYSIA

Putrajaya is a city in Malaysia, south of Kuala Lumpur. It's known for its beautiful late-20th-century architecture including the Putra Mosque, made from rose-colored granite with a pink dome. Nearby is the immense, green-domed Perdana Putra, which contains the prime minister's office complex. The 3tiered Putra Bridge is inspired by Iranian architecture, with 4 minaret-type piers overlooking the manmade Putrajaya Lake.

Officially the Federal Territory of Putrajaya (Malay: Wilayah Persekutuan Putrajaya), is a planned city and the federal administrative centre of the Malaysian capital. The seat of the federal government was shifted in 1999 from Kuala Lumpur to Putrajaya because of overcrowding and congestion in the former. Kuala Lumpur remains as Malaysia's national capital per the constitution, and is still the seat of the King of Malaysia and the Parliament, as well as being the country's commercial and financial centre. The establishment of Putrajaya was the idea of the then-Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad.

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The Putra Mosque (Malay: Masjid Putra) is the principal mosque of Putrajaya, Malaysia. Construction of the mosque began in 1997 and was completed two years later. It is located on Putra Square and is adjacent to man-made Putrajaya Lake. The pink-domed Putra Mosque is constructed with rose-tinted granite and consists of three main functional areas – the prayer hall, the Sahn, or courtyard, and various learning facilities and function rooms. The mosque can accommodate 15,000 worshippers at any one time

PETRONAS Twin Towers: Situated at an astonishing height of 170m (558 feet), the PETRONAS Twin Towers' double-decker skybridge is the highest two-story bridge in the world. Visitors from all over the world come here to catch an awesome view over Kuala Lumpur city.

Genting highlands: Genting Highlands is a hill station located on the peak of Mount Ulu Kali in the Titiwangsa Mountains, central Peninsular Malaysia, at 1800 metres elevation. Located in the state of Pahang. It was established in 1965 by the late Malaysian businessman Lim Goh Tong. The primary tourist attraction is Resorts World Genting, a hill resort where casinos and theme parks are situated and where gambling is permitted. Many of Pahang's skyscrapers can be found here.

Batu Caves: Batu Caves (Tamil: 山克马山のの, romanized: Pattumalai) is a mogote (a type of karst landform) that has a series of caves and cave temples in Gombak, Selangor, Malaysia. It takes its name from the Malay word batu, meaning 'rock'. The cave complex is one of the most popular Hindu shrines outside India, and is dedicated to Murugan. It is the focal point of the Tamil festival of Thaipusam in Malaysia.Batu Caves in short, is also referred to as 10th Caves or Hill for Murugan as there are six important holy shrines in India and four more in Malaysia. The three others in Malaysia are Kallumalai Temple in Ipoh, Tanneermalai Temple in Penang and Sannasimalai Temple in Malacca.

Independence Square (Malay: Dataran Merdeka) is a square located in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. It is situated in front of the Sultan Abdul Samad Building. It was formerly known as the Selangor Club Padang or simply the Padang (meaning "field" in Malay) and was used as the cricket green of the Selangor Club (now the Royal Selangor Club). It was here that the Union Flag was lowered and the Malaysian flag hoisted for the first time at midnight on 31 August 1957. Since then, the Independence Square has been the usual venue for the annual Independence Day Parade.

The Thean Hou Temple is a six-tiered temple of the Chinese sea goddess Mazu located in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. It is located on 1.67 acres (6,758 m2) of land atop Robson Heights on Lorong Bellamy, overlooking Jalan Syed Putra. It was completed in 1987 and officially opened in 1989. The temple was built by Hainanese living in Malaysia and the property belongs to and is run by the Selangor and Federal Territory Hainan Association (Malay: Hainan Selangor and Wilayah Persekutuan). It is one of the largest temples in Southeast Asia.

Industrial Visit Report on U R Rao Satellite Centre (URSC), Bangalore

The Semester I MBA students went to the industrial visit to U R Rao Satellite Centre **Bangalore on March 22, 2024 at 2:00 pm.** The objective of the industrial visit is to encourage & motivate students for building their carrier in activities related to management and managing of people. It will benefit the students in their domain and shape student's professional carrier path. The students can relate to the academic business concepts in an effective manner by correlating it.

The students were accompanied by two faculty members **Dr. B.Senthil Kumar and Dr.Shagufta Showkat**. The students were taken to a training room to acquaint them with demonstrating and creating awareness about the history, techniques and methodologies of applied sciences and modern inventions. The numerous exhibits collected and kept over the years simplify complex ideas and display the application of scientific developments and their adaptation by ISRO that has led to the growth of development in space.

The students were explained about the renowned CHANDRAYAAN-1, the India's first mission to the moon, was the first spacecraft to make the most significant discovery of water on the lunar surface. We were told that the discovery of few ice sheets of water in the permanently shadowed craters. The Space science missions like Chandrayaan-3, Mars Orbiter Mission and Astros at have received World Wide acclaim and put India in the global map. More than 100 state-of-the-art satellites built over four decades by URSC. The centre also houses ultra-modern design, development, fabrication and testing facilities for satellites and all related details related to that were also told to students.

In the Industrial the visit students were guided by Dr. S. L. Shrinivasa Scientist, ISRO Satellite Centre and a video playback was shown to students, covering satellite, rocket assembling to launching. The detailed working was explained by Dr. Shrinivasa which created a curiosity among the students.

In the third session of visit the satellite and launch vehicles exhibition were shown to students which remarkably helped students to gain practical knowledge from models of satellites and launch vehicles. Exhibits also has a collection of various original electronics, mechanical etc. components that were used in satellite manufacturing. The major specifications of propulsion mode were also explained to the students like lunar pole orbit, Mission life, power generation and Attitude sensors. The major events about the launching are

1. Chandrayaan -3 successfully launched into orbit.

2. Trans lunar injection and the orbit achieved.

3. Lander module was successfully separated from the propulsion module.

4. Chandrayaan -3-soft landing on the moon surface.

Then the glimpses of Pre launch operations were shown comprising of

1. Scatsat-1 testing

2. Vehicle at launch pad

3. PS2 stacking

4. PS1 segment Assembly.

Finally the students were asking question to the scientist and got their queries clarified. All the questions of the students were perfectly addressed by the scientist.

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






